SUMMER BRIDGE MATH

WHO: Incoming 7th and 8th grade students

WHEN: **May 30–June 16**, 7:45 a.m. – 12:50 p.m. Monday through Friday, including breakfast and lunch periods.

Englewood Schools' Summer Bridge Math program is offered to students who will be in 7th or 8th grade for Fall 2017. The program is targeted for 7th grade students interested in advancing in math and are candidates for Pre-Algebra in 7th grade and Algebra in 8th grade. The program also targets 8th grade students who desire a stronger foundation in 7th grade math standards as they enter 8th grade math. The Summer Bridge Math program is designed by AVID for the purpose of accelerating students in math. Instruction is provided by teachers experienced in this curriculum.

Breakfast and lunch provided daily. Bus transportation provided at summer schedule bus stops in the morning and after the program, dropping off at Englewood Middle School at 7:45 a.m. and picking students up at 12:50 p.m.

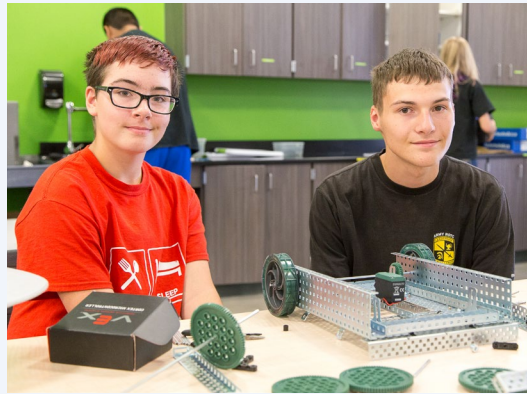
METRO SUMMER SCIENCE INSTITUTE
